APPALACHIAN BUCK DANCING

TENNESSEE VALLEY OLD TIME FIDDLERS CONVENTION Athens State University, Athens, Alabama

- A. <u>GENERAL REGULATIONS</u>: Every contestant should read their specific category rules thoroughly. Depending on the category, regulations deal with proper order of tunes (i.e. Fiddle), time limits, tuning requirements and other items as dictated by a particular event.
 - 1. Playing order will be assigned by random computer selection and posted when category registration closes.
 - 2. The contest rules and regulations may be amended depending on the situation and events at hand during the convention.
 - 3. The judges' decision will be final.
 - 4. The judges will not be permitted to enter or play in any contest category.
 - 5. No electrical instruments or drums will be permitted in any category. No DI permitted. Each instrument must use mic provided by sound company.
 - 6. No contestant will be permitted to register for any category after the registration for that category has closed. Contestant must be present and in proper drawn position for entry onto the stage when their name is called from the staging area. Late arrivals or no-shows will be eliminated from the event. Allowances may be made for broken strings and other happenings judged to be beyond the control of the contestant(s).
 - 7. Contestants must have instruments tuned and ready to play when called to the stage.
 - 8. Judges will <u>NOT</u> be allowed to advise contestants in their selection of tune to be played.
 - 9. All contestants are advised that competitions are also being held on the Founders Hall Stage. You must be present in any category to participate. No allowances will be made, nor refunds given for contestants in multiple categories that may overlap in different locations. Choose your categories wisely!
 - 10. For any category that has Saturday night Finals, a contestant must be present and participate to place. A finalist not present will result in awarding their slot to the contestant with the next highest score.

B. **CATEGORY RULES:**

1. This event should consist of <u>authentic old time dancing in true Appalachian</u> <u>tradition flat-footing style</u>. <u>TAPS ARE PERMITTED</u>. The arms should not be flounced but should be held loosely at the sides of the body. The feet should be kept parallel to the floor and as close to the floor as possible (kicks, Charleston steps, crossovers, clogging steps, exaggerated backward / side steps are prohibited). The contestant should keep the head and shoulders as level as possible.

APPALACHIAN BUCK DANCING (Continued)

This is not a "no holds barred" contest, but a contest that stresses the traditional Appalachian "flat-footing" style. Eight (8) finalists will be selected from the eliminations. First (1st) through eighth (8th) place winners will be selected during the finals.

2. Any contestant (entry) who has won first (1st) place for two (2) consecutive years will not be allowed to compete in the same category the following year.

C. **JUDGING CRITERIA:**

1. Rhythm and Timing (25 points):

The rhythm and timing should be even and consistent.

The judges will look for the "feeling" that the contestant puts into the performance. Flat, mechanical and unfeeling performances may result in lost points as will excessive "showmanship".

BEGINNER BANJO / BEGINNER MANDOLIN / BEGINNER GUITAR

TENNESSEE VALLEY OLD TIME FIDDLERS CONVENTION Athens State University, Athens, Alabama

These are the rules and regulations that apply to the following category: *Beginner Banjo / Mandolin / Guitar (12 and under)*

NOTE: The Beginner Banjo / Mandolin / Guitar competition will take place on Brown Hall Stage located behind Founders Hall. This competition will play one (1) round only. Winners will be chosen after the conclusion of that competition. NO FINALS. A contestant 12 and under who enters this category is not allowed in the general individual competition with the same instrument.

 - 1. Playing order will be assigned by random computer selection and posted when category registration closes.
 - 2. The contest rules and regulations may be amended depending on the situation and events at hand during the convention.
 - 3. The judges' decisions will be final.
 - 4. The judges will not be permitted to enter or play in any contest category.
 - 5. No electrical instruments or drums will be permitted in any category. No DI permitted. Each instrument must use mic provided by sound company.
 - 6. No contestant will be permitted to register for any category after the registration for that category has closed. BEGINNER BANJO / BEGINNER MANDOLIN / BEGINNER GUITAR (Continued)

B. **CATEGORY RULES:**

- 1. Contestants in the Beginner Banjo / Mandolin / Guitar category must be age 12 or under.
- 2. The same contestant may enter each category of the Beginner Banjo / Mandolin / Guitar competition.
- 3. Contestant will play ONE (1) tune.
- 4. First (1st) through eighth (8th) place winners will be selected.
- 5. Any contestant (entry) who has won first (1st) place for two (2) consecutive years will not be allowed to compete in the same category the following year.
- 6. Once a Beginner Banjo/Mandolin/Guitar has entered the general competition he/she may not re-enter the Beginner category in subsequent years.
- 7. Contestant may perform unaccompanied or with a maximum of two (2) accompanists.

C. **JUDGING CRITERIA:**

1. Rhythm and Timing (25 points):

The rhythm and timing should be even and consistent. Any jerking, rushing, dragging, or unevenness in tempo of the performance will result in a loss of points.

2. Creativity (25 points):

The judges will listen for minor variations and improvisations. However, creativity should not be excessive to change or destroy the basic melody line of the tune. This may result in a loss of points.

3. Expression (25 points):

The judges will listen for the "feeling" that the contestant puts into the performance. Flat, mechanical and unfeeling performances may result in lost points as will excessive "showmanship".

4. Execution (25 points):

The judges will listen for the tonal quality and clarity of the performance together with the general command of the instruments.

BEGINNER FIDDLER & APPRENTICE FIDDLER

TENNESSEE VALLEY OLD TIME FIDDLERS CONVENTION Athens State University, Athens, Alabama

These are the rules and regulations that apply to the following categories: BEGINNER FIDDLER (Age 10 and under) and APPRENTICE FIDDLER (Age 11- 15)

NOTE: Beginner Fiddler competition will take place on the Brown Hall Stage. Apprentice Fiddler competition will take place on the Founders Hall Stage. Contestants in these categories ARE NOT permitted to play in the Classic Old Time Fiddle category. Bethe Tennessee Valley Fiddle Champion category. Both Beginner and Apprentice Fiddler will play one (1) round only. Winners will be chosen after the conclusion of that competition. No finals.

- A. <u>GENERAL REGULATIONS:</u> Every contestant should read their specific category rules thoroughly. Depending on the category, regulations deal with proper order of tunes (i.e. Fiddle), time limits, tuning requirements and other items as dictated by a particular event.
 - 1. Playing order will be assigned by random computer selection and posted when category registration closes.
 - 2. The contest rules and regulations may be amended depending on the situation and events at hand during the convention.
 - 3. The judges' decision will be final.
 - 4. The judges will not be permitted to enter or play in any contest category.
 - 5. No electrical instruments or drums will be permitted in any category. No DI permitted. Each instrument must use mic provided by sound company.

BEGINNER FIDDLER & APPRENTICE FIDDLER (Continued)

B. **CATEGORY RULES:**

- 1. Contestants in the <u>Beginner Fiddler</u> category will play TWO (2) tunes; one (1) fast and one (1) slow in <u>NO PARTICULAR ORDER</u>.
- 2. Contestants in the <u>Apprentice Fiddler</u> category will play TWO (2) tunes; a breakdown and a waltz (*PLAYED IN THAT ORDER*).
- 3. First (1st) through eighth (8th) place winners will be selected.
- 4. The contestant may have a maximum of 2 (two) accompanists. Preferably guitar(s), however, mandolin and bass may be allowed.
- 5. Any contestant who has won first (1st) place for two (2) consecutive years will not be allowed to compete in the same category the following year.
- 6. No tuning other than standard tuning is allowed in any Fiddle category other than Classic Old Time Fiddle.
- 7. Competitors in these categories <u>are not eligible</u> to compete in the Classic Old Time Fiddler or the Tennessee Valley Old Time Fiddle categories.
- 8. A Beginner Fiddler (10 and under) may enter the Apprentice Fiddler (11 15) category <u>BUT NOT BOTH</u>. Once a Beginner Fiddler has entered the apprentice Fiddler category or he/she may not re-enter the Beginner category in subsequent years.
- An Apprentice Fiddler (11 -15) may enter the Tennessee Valley Fiddle Champion Category <u>BUT NOT BOTH</u>. Once an Apprentice Fiddler has entered the Tennessee Valley Fiddle Champion category he/she may not re-enter the Apprentice Fiddler category in subsequent years.
- 10. Contestants in the Beginner and Apprentice Fiddler categories <u>are NOT eligible</u> to compete for the *Tennessee Valley Fiddle Champion* title.

C. JUDGING CRITERIA:

1. Rhythm and Timing (25 points):

The rhythm and timing should be even and consistent. Any jerking, rushing, dragging or unevenness in tempo of the performance will result in a loss of points.

2. Creativity (25 points):

The judges will listen for minor variations and improvisations. However, the creativity should not be excessive so as to change or destroy the basic melody line of the tune. This may result in a loss of points.

3. Expression (25 points):

The judges will listen for the "feeling" that the contestant puts into the performance. Flat, mechanical and unfeeling performances may result in lost points as will excessive "showmanship".

BEGINNER FIDDLER & APPRENTICE FIDDLER (Continued)

4. Execution (25 points):

The judges will listen for the tonal quality and clarity of the performance together with the general command of the instrument(s).

- 2. Each judging category has a potential of 25 points, for a possible score of 100 points per tune. Points scored in the eliminations WILL NOT be carried over into the finals.
- 3. All contestants/performers are urged to consider the placement of the microphones and the efforts of the persons responsible for the sound system. The judges will judge exactly what they hear. An instrument too close or too far away from a microphone could distort or drop out the sound, resulting in a loss of points. BLUEGRASS BAND

TENNESSEE VALLEY OLD TIME FIDDLERS CONVENTION Athens State University, Athens, Alabama

If the Bluegrass Band category has eight (8) or fewer contestants, we reserve the right to skip the preliminary round, and all contestants will compete only during the Saturday afternoon finals.

- 12. READ THE BAND CATEGORY RULES BELOW CAREFULLY. THEY HAVE CHANGED REGARDING BAND REGISTRATION AND ID REQUIREMENTS.

B. **CATEGORY RULES**:

1. Bands will perform <u>TWO</u> (2) tunes in the eliminations and <u>TWO</u> (2) tunes in the finals (however, if time becomes a factor, bands may be restricted to ONE (1) tune in the elimination round). The tunes may be either vocal or instrumental, however, it is recommended that a vocal be included with instrumentation to demonstrate band versatility. Eight (8) finalists will be selected from the

BLUEGRASS BAND (Continued)

eliminations. First (1st) through eighth (8th) place winners will be selected during the finals.

- 2. A band that has won first (1st) place for two (2) consecutive years will not be allowed to compete in the same category the following year. However, they may compete as a different band after a two-year win provided no more than two of the original winning band members are in the band. In order to ensure this requirement, all bands will be required to provide photo IDs for each member of the band at the time of registration as well as stand for a registration photo. Prior to Finals band member's IDs will be required to be checked and matched to photo. A BLUEGRASS BAND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO REGISTER UNTIL ALL MEMBERS ARE PRESENT AT REGISTRATION (This includes, for example, waiting until a pickup band meeting the requirements is ready to register)
- 3. Band members may not be changed or added between the eliminations and the finals. However, if necessary, a band may LOSE a member between the eliminations and finals provided the minimum instrumentation of fiddle, banjo and guitar are met. Should a band lose the original banjo, guitar or fiddle player between eliminations and finals they will be eliminated from the competition and awarded no place.
- 4. Tunes/Songs performed in the eliminations <u>SHALL NOT</u> be repeated by the same contestant (or contestants, in the case of the Bands) in the finals.
- 5. The band shall consist of at least three (3) members but not more than six (6). Minimum instruments shall be a fiddle, a banjo, and a guitar.
- 6. Band members can participate in ONE (1) band only in this category. The use of Scruggs type tuners on the banjo is not allowed during the performance.
- 7. All band members <u>MUST</u> demonstrate an ability to play the instrument they are holding and *make a significant contribution to the performance.*

If the Old Time String Band category has eight (8) or fewer contestants, we reserve the right to skip the preliminary round, and all contestants will compete only during the Saturday afternoon finals.

<u>GENERAL REGULATIONS:</u> Every contestant should read their specific category rules thoroughly. Depending on the category, regulations deal with proper order of tunes (i.e. Fiddle), time limits, tuning requirements and other items as dictated by a particular event.

- 1. Playing order will be assigned by random computer selection and posted when category registration closes.
- 2. The contest rules and regulations may be amended depending on the situation and events at hand during the convention.
- 3. The judges' decision will be final.
- 4. The judges will not be permitted to enter or play in any contest category.
- 5. No electrical instruments or drums will be permitted in any category. No DI permitted. Each instrument must use mic provided by sound company.
- 6. No contestant will be permitted to register for any category after the registration for that category has closed.
- 7. Contestant must be present and in proper drawn position for entry onto the stage when their name is called from the staging area. Late arrivals or no-shows will be eliminated from the event. Allowances may be made for broken strings and other happenings judged to be beyond the control of the contestant(s).
- 8. Contestants must have instruments tuned and ready to play when called to the stage.
- 9. Judges will <u>NOT</u> be allowed to advise contestants in their selection of tune to be played.

- 1. Bands will perform TWO (2) numbers in the eliminations and TWO (2) in the finals (however, if time becomes a factor, bands may be restricted to ONE (1) number in the elimination round). The selections may be either vocal or instrumental. However, it is recommended that a vocal be included with the instrumentation to demonstrate the band's versatility. Eight (8) finalists will be selected from the eliminations. First (1st) through eighth (8th) place winners will be selected during the finals.
- 2. Any Old Time String Band that has won first (1st) place for two (2) consecutive years will not be allowed to compete in the same category the following year.
- 3. However, they may compete as a different band after a two year win provided no more than two of the original winning band members are in the band. In order to ensure this requirement, all bands will be required to provide photo IDs for each member of the band at the time of registration as well as stand for a registration photo. Prior to the Finals band member's IDs will be required to be checked and matched to photo. AN OLD TIME STRING BAND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO REGISTER UNTIL ALL MEMBERS ARE PRESENT AT REGISTRATION (This includes, for example, waiting until a pickup band meeting the requirements is ready to register)
- 4. Band members may not be changed or added between the eliminations and the finals. However, if necessary, a band may LOSE a member between the eliminations and finals provided the minimum instrumentation of fiddle, banjo and guitar are met. Should a band lose the original banjo, guitar or fiddle player between eliminations and finals they will be eliminated from the competition and awarded no place.
- 5. Tunes/Songs performed in the eliminations <u>SHALL NOT</u> be repeated by the same contestant (or contestants, in the case of the Bands) in the finals.
- 6. The band shall consist of at least three (3) members but not more than six (6). Minimum instruments shall be a fiddle, a banjo, and a guitar. Band members can participate in ONE (1) band only in this category. <u>Bluegrass style banjo not allowed fingerpicks not permitted on banjo.</u> Lead instrument is NOT limited to the fiddle. All band members <u>MUST</u> demonstrate an ability to play the instrument they are holding and make a significant contribution to the performance.

C. JUDGING CRITERIA:
